### Alumni Board of Advisers Established to Guide Delta Delta

Undergraduates and Alumni Work Together to Ensure Firm Financial Condition

Because of the precarious financial condition of the chapter, the Property Association and Alumni Chapter jointly requested that the Office of the Executive Director of Sigma Nu authorize the establishment of an Alumni Board of Advisers for Delta Delta. Authorization was received on January 9. The Board will have direct control and final authority on all chapter activities. The members of

the recently formed Alumni Board of Advisers are listed on page 3.

All of the alumni officers and directors are committed to this action and will provide assistance to the Board and the undergraduate chapter as requested by the Board.

The Board's plan of action follows. Estimated dates for completion for each item are in brackets.

1. The Alumni Board of Advisers ("the Board") will hold a mandatory meeting with the undergraduate chapter to explain the Action Plan and obtain a written commitment to that plan from each undergraduate brother. Any brother who is unwilling to fully commit to this plan will be dismissed from further participation in the chapter. Those members who do commit will have an opportu(Continued on Page 2)

nity to continue in the rebuilding of the chapter [Meeting was held on January 26].

- 2. The meeting will be followed by a goalsetting and chapter planning workshop involving all undergraduate brothers and the Alumni Board. [Workshop held January 26]
- 3. Under the guidance of the Board, the undergraduate members will prepare a rush plan with both short- and long-term goals. This action has already been requested. The plan will be approved by the Board and overseen by the Board's Alumni Chapter representative. [Submitted and approved at the January 26 meeting]
- 4. Under the guidance of the Board, the undergraduate brothers will prepare a budget to support all chapter activities for the spring semester 2002. In addition, the undergraduate brothers will prepare a proposed house operating budget for the 2002/2003 academic year with the guidance of chapter financial advisers. The budget will include obligations to Sigma Nu (National). [Spring budget completed in February 2002; fall budget, March 2002]
- 5. Working directly with the Board, the undergraduate brothers will develop and implement a plan to acquire tenants for fall 2002 to make up for any shortfall realized during spring rush. This plan will build on actions initiated in November 2001. [Completed, February 2002]
- 6. All undergraduate brothers will be required to attend workshops to include, but not limited to, the following topics: (a) Effective planning and implementation of rush; and (b) Chapter financial management and budgeting. [Financial management and budgeting seminar held on March 16, 2002]
- 7. The Board will review the undergraduate chapter bylaws to ensure that they appropriately address, at a minimum, risk management, individual financial obligations, cleaning responsibilities and conditions for brothers living outside the chapter house. The Board will make revisions as appropriate. [April 2002]

- 8. Risk management procedures for all social functions will be approved in advance by the Board. [Completed at January 26 meeting]
- 9. Each undergraduate brother will be required to attend one 8-hour work session per semester for the purpose of chapter house maintenance and minor repairs. Plans for these work sessions will be prepared by the undergraduate chapter, approved by the Board, and overseen by a Property Association representative on the Board. [Last month of each semester during the life of the Board]
- 10. All undergraduate brothers will be required to sign a lease agreement for the 2002/2003 academic year by the end of April 2002. [April 2002]
- 11. The undergradute chapter will appoint a committee to work directly with the Alumni Chapter to develop and implement a plan to improve relations between the undergraduate brothers and alumni. [Completed at January 26 meeting]
- 12. The undergraduate chapter will appoint a committee to work directly with the Property Association to identify, estimate and prioritize chapter house improvements. [Completed at January 26 meeting]
- 13. The Board will recommend its dissolution after the Measures of Success (next section) have been achieved. The alumni expect that these measures can be achieved no later than April 2003.
- The Measures of Success are:
  1. Completion of planning, budgeting and training activities discussed in the Action Plan;
- 2. Implementation of the rejuvenated rush program;
- 3. A total of 35 undergraduates living in the chapter house, or signed leases for that total for the subsequent semester;
- 4. A functioning plan in place to achieve 90 percent occupancy by undergraduate brothers within one year;

- 5. A functioning plan in place to augment the occupancy of the chapter house with unaffiliated boarders;
- 6. A demonstrated ability, for at least one full semester, that the undergraduate chapter can comply with all internal financial controls, live within its budget, and not incur an operating deficit; and
- 7. A demonstrated commitment to the ideals of Sigma Nu and the obligations associated with membership.

As noted above, many of the Action Plan milestones have been achieved. We've had two very productive meetings between the Board and the undergraduate chapter, and we hope to have our 2002/2003 budgets finalized by the time you get this newsletter. We plan to have 22 brothers living in the house next year. To supplement our income, we plan to have 6 to ten boarders living in the house. Our goal is to have all lease agreements distributed, signed and returned by April 20. Because we need at least 30 residents to afford a cook, we plan to have a less costly catered meal service next year.

I'm very impressed with the leadership and commitment demonstrated by the undergraduate chapter during these difficult times. I'm looking forward to working with them to expeditiously achieve our measures of success.

Your generous donations have helped us pay past due debts but without a steady income from the undergraduate chapter, our fixed costs continued to add to our debt load. Our accounts payable totaled approximately \$17,000 in December. To raise some income, we assessed a spring semester out-of-house fee of \$300 for each undergraduate and rented parking spaces to both undergraduates and non-affiliated "friends of the house." We raised approximately \$8,000 from these sources. In addition, we rented rooms to alumni who returned for New Year's Eve, netting over \$1,000. We plan to rent rooms for the Blue-White Weekend (April 19 - 21) as well. However, these sources were insufficient to pay all our debts and meet new costs such as the winter heating bills. As a result, we went to settlement on a mortgage of \$50,000 on January 22. Using the proceeds from this loan and the money raised from

the sources discussed above, we are current on all debts. Your continued generosity will reduce the amount we have to use from the mortgage loan and thereby expedite our repayment. The chapter house is generally in good physical condition but it has experienced some wear and tear. The wood floor on the first floor needs to be replaced and the dining room furniture is beginning to show its age. Renovations in these and

other areas will have to wait until the chapter is on firmer financial footing. As you are aware, my predecessor, Bob Leyburn '52, spearheaded a campaign to raise money to renovate the housemother's suite. These funds, totaling approximately \$14,000 have been placed in a separate, interest-bearing account and will only be used for the purpose originally planned. However, the Property Association has concluded that we must

focus our attention on the overall financial condition of the chapter before undertaking any discretionary capital improvements. My personal goal is to initiate renovations of the suite next spring.

Thanks for your continuing support, and I hope to see you on Blue/White weekend, April 19-21!!


### Return to the house to reconnect!


