Second, we are getting an estimate to replace the walkway that leads up to the house. The slate has deteriorated to the point that safety is becoming a concern. Finally, we will begin planning for the installation of a sprinkler system mandated by State College borough code to be installed by September 2008.

Since taking over as President of the Property Association about five years ago, I've concentrated on fiscal discipline and a focused approach to financial management. Part of this approach is our annual Planning & Budgeting Meeting with the Active Chapter. This year's meeting was held February 4th. The Active Chapter ended the fall semester with a significant surplus, and we expect the same from spring operations. Additionally, increased occupancy brings surplus to our projected budget for Fall 2006, allowing us to retain the house bill at its current amount for the next academic year, while increasing the rent that the Active Chapter pays to the Association.
