Expect Implementation of a Continuous Program to Monitor and Maintain the Physical Condition of the House

Our big news is the initiation of our capital campaign - Building a New Legacy. By now, you should have received a campaign brochure. If you haven't been contacted by an alumni volunteer, you will in the very near future. Please give this campaign your thoughtful consideration. As described in the brochure, our goal is to raise \$600,000 over five years to fund much-needed improvements. Claim your share of our campaign and celebrate our centennial with the commitment it deserves by doing your part to position Delta Delta for its next 100 years. After our active campaign closes in January 2008, our Building Committee, chaired by Brother Dave Parker '91, will revise our capital improvement plan based on the results of the campaign.

Our Vice President, **Ed Sidwell '58**, is working with the university on a cooperative plan to improve the landscaping on the south

side of the House (the side that faces Phi Delta Theta). Several concepts have been discussed and we are still in the formative stages of this project. A key factor in our decision will be the overall cost and the level of cost sharing by the university.

In response to several suggestions from alumni, Ed Sidwell and I are examining ways to improve our management of the property. We are examining contract options as well as services provided through the Fraternity Purchasing Association. The goal is to implement a continuous program to monitor the physical condition of the Chapter House and a more effective plan regarding repairs and maintenance.


