CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Though Campaign Falls Short of Goal, Much Can Be Said for the Active Chapter's Support

Undergraduate Members Pledge More Than \$37,000 to House Renovation Efforts

Our formal capital campaign, *Building a New Legacy*, ended on January 31. However, we are still in the process of contacting some alumni and accepting pledges. To date, our pledge total is \$295,653, and \$95,595 has been collected as a result of these pledges.

Although we did not achieve our goal, we have received sufficient pledges to pay off our long-term debt, which includes the loan for the sprinkler system and payment of all of our campaign expenses. We also will have funds remaining for selected capital improvements. Because we did not achieve our goal, we need to re-evaluate our renovation plans and adjust our priorities. I will be working with our Building Committee and the Board of Directors over the next few months to develop such a revised capital improvement plan.

To ensure that our capital investments

are maintained, we have initiated weekly walk-through inspections by a contractor to identify needed repairs and breakage. Security deposits are debited, if appropriate.

We had tremendous support from the active chapter throughout the campaign. Their pledges totaled \$37,700 (approximately 13% of total pledges received). The active members conducted three phone-a-thons and were able to reach and connect with many of you. Without these efforts, many of our alumni would never have been contacted. Our Eminent Commander wrote a truly inspiring letter concerning why men join Delta Delta, which you should have received last fall.

PROPERTY ASSOCIATION Q&A

"The House Belongs to All of Us"

Property Association President **Bob Nelson** '72 shares the successes and challenges of the *Building a New Legacy* campaign and why we should all be supporting the house preservation efforts.



Why did you get involved as a chair with the Building a New Legacy capital campaign?

We had to install a sprinkler system to comply with Borough requirements, and we didn't have the funds to pay for it. Estimates at the time

were as high as \$100,000. An additional mortgage loan would have required significantly higher house bills in a very competitive fraternity environment. As the strongest proponent of a capital campaign and president of the housing corporation, I felt a strong obligation to lead the campaign. In addition, I was confident that I had the leadership and management skills needed. The only question in my mind was the level of potential alumni support

Why would you encourage other alumni to get involved with Sigma Nu in their adult years?

First, the house belongs to all of us. Each of us is a "stockholder" and has a stake in the chapter's success. I am extremely proud to be a Delta Delta and I love to show off our home. I have many memories of my undergrad years at PSU, and Sigma Nu is a large part of those. Absent the nostalgia, I enjoy working with the undergrads and helping (albeit in a small way) to mold them as leaders and allow them the opportunity to have the experiences that will lead to fond memories, similar to mine.

What has been the most rewarding part of your volunteer experience? Why?

Helping to salvage the chapter from its "near-death experience" of 2000 to 2001 when the entire active chapter moved out of the house for the entire academic year. Had individuals such as Ed Sidwell '58, Doug Kosydar '94, Mike Sweeney '92 and me not stepped forward, the chapter would have folded.

What has been the most challenging? Why?

My most difficult challenge has trying to convince alumni to support the campaign both as volunteers and as financial contributors. This was a much "harder sell" than I anticipated and I'm a terrible salesman. That's one of the reasons I work for the government. We were trying to bridge several generations with vastly different memories, customs, traditions, and cultures. I suspect that all fraternity fund raisers face similar challenges but for us, it was significant.

What are some of the things you've been involved in as chairman of the campaign and the steering committee?

I've been involved in essentially every aspect of the campaign beginning with the strategic assessment conducted by Pennington and Company in 2004, the feasibility study conducted by Affinity Connection in 2006, and the campaign itself from 2006 to 2008. I negotiated the contract with Affinity Connection and its extension. I developed our frequently asked questions resource document, the first draft of the campaign case statement, the house history contained in the brochure, and the capital improvement plan. I managed the contract with Affinity Connection and served as the official point of contact with the firm's campaign manager and lead gift officer. I obtained the loan from Nittany Bank to pay for the sprinkler system and fund the campaign. I contacted or attempted to contact more than 80 alumni to solicit pledges. I chaired our weekly telephone conferences. I reported on progress in my corporate annual report and I prepared an assessment after the close of the official campaign. I am continuing with follow-up activities.

Because we did not achieve our goal, a major next step is to revise our capital improvement plan to be consistent with our anticipated resources.

What is your favorite Sigma Nu memory?

If I don't say that it is meeting my wife, a former Sigma Nu Little Sister, I'd be in big trouble. However, another fond memory is beating the brothers in our end of Hell Week brothers-pledges tackle football game followed by body surfing in the party room.

What is your advice for future undergraduates of Delta Delta?

The same basic advice that I gave my son when he left for college – study hard and "play" hard, in that order of priority. I succeeded in both of those areas. My four years at PSU were the four most memorable years of my life and I hope that others can share that assessment.

Why should alumni attend one (or more!) of the many great upcoming events that the Alumni Association has planned?

To relive and share memories, generate new ones, reconnect with your contemporaries, and share your experiences past and present with our undergraduate brothers while enjoying the beauty of Happy Valley and the glory of Penn State.

Is there anything else you'd like to ask of the alumni brotherhood?

The campaign fell well short of its goal. Therefore, planned projects must be delayed or dropped. For those who have not pledged, I ask that they thoughtfully reassess their position and make a pledge. For those who have pledged, I ask for your continued support, and if your financial circumstances allow, to increase your pledge.

Sigma Nu Raises \$15,075.12 for THON; Active Brothers Donate More Than \$37,000 to Capital Campaign

alone raised \$15,075.12 to the 2008 dance marathon. The overall THON total this year was \$6,615,318.04, which set a new record. Proceeds benefit the Four Diamonds Fund, an organization that supports families of kids with cancer.

The active chapter organized our Super Bowl party to be viewed on our new 52-inch Samsung LCD TV, which was purchased by the Property Association for the house in appreciation of the active chapter's help with the capital campaign. Our undergraduate brothers pledged more than \$37,000 to the effort, and also held several phone-a-thons this year to help reconnect our alumni brotherhood. The Property Association also purchased 30 new chairs for multi-purpose use. A big thank you goes to Brother **Ed Sidwell '58** for his work to find the best deals in town.

Academically, we are doing well this year. Our current GPA is 3.01. Seven brothers were named to the Dean's list last semester: **Rob Beal, Mike Cline, Ed Pushkarewicz, Jim Sekel, Tim Settles and Pat Thompson**.
