CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Significantly Improving Delta Delta's Financial Management

Capital Improvement Plan and "Bursar Billing" Implemented to Complete House Repairs and to Improve Cash Flow, Reduce Accounting Costs

Our "Building a New Legacy" campaign concluded on January 31, 2008. We received a total of 170 pledges with a total amount pledged of \$299,403. A total of \$111,124 has been donated to date. A special thanks is extended to the following alumni who participated extensively in the capital campaign: Andy Hackett '05, Don Bain '66, Hank Garfield '67, Joel Gladfelter '01, Leigh Gunn '90, Bill Hoffman '73, Anthony Italiano '94, Lane Kintigh '89, Bill Kirschner '66, Doug Kosydar '94, Adam Krugh, Derek Lehman '95, Bob Leyburn '52, James MacLaughlin '59, Dave Parker '91, Brandon Peterson '00, Steve Rodrigo '87, Ernest Russom '79, Dan Seitz '04, Bob Seuffert '96, James Shincovich '67, Dan Spada, Mike Sweeney '92, and Mike Virag '95. Because the campaign fell well short of its goal of \$600,000, the Association is developing a revised Capital Improvement Plan consistent with the expected campaign proceeds. This revised plan will be presented at the annual Homecoming meeting.

Association funds were used for the following activities related to the chapter house: minor code inspection-related repairs; weekly walk-through inspections; numerous miscellaneous repairs including a variety of electrical, heating, structural, and plumbing repairs; purchase and installation of a television and home theater system in the Chapter/Living Room; purchase of new Dining Room chairs; replacement of the hot water heater heat exchanger; installation of cipher locks on the second and third floor fire escape exit doors; and painting of the second and third floor sprinkler piping.

In what we expect to be a significant

improvement in our financial management, we implemented "bursar billing" for the first time for the fall 2008 semester. Under this system, the university will bill the brothers for house bills, security deposits, and out-of-house fees at no direct cost to the Association or the active chapter. We expect improved cash flow, reduction/elimination of delinquent accounts, and reduced accounting costs as a result of this initiative.

For the upcoming academic year, the Association held a kickoff meeting with the active chapter on Sunday, August 31. In addition, we plan to conduct our annual Homecoming meeting on October 18 (beginning at 11:00 a.m.), a budgeting and planning meeting with the active chapter on January 31 in conjunction with a retreat, and a short meeting with the active chapter on Saturday of Blue/White weekend. The Association plans to host a buffet-style dinner following the Blue/White game in April 2009 and a cookout on Saturday of Arts Fest in July.

The new recruitment system calls for more alcohol-free recruiting events. Recruitment Chair **Noah Karn** has met this goal by implementing Values Based Recruiting strategies provided by the national fraternity. On September 8, we had over 150 recruits pass through the house. These men were entertained by a live band playing on the front porch, the Monday Night Football broadcast being shown on a projection screen on the front lawn and continuous house tours provided by several different brothers.

Our current Homecoming Chair **Mike Cline** has us preparing for what should be another successful showing in the Homecoming Competition. We are once again partnered with the Society of Women Engineers (SWE). Our theme of Peter Pan has the house excited, as we are already beginning to design this year's float.
