PROPERTY ASSOCIATION REPORT

An Update on Needed Repairs at the Delta Delta House

Although no decisions on future capital projects have been made, we're beginning to scope several long-needed repairs.

The tile floor in the basement is in very bad condition. The existing floor tile contains asbestos causing its removal to be expensive. Our contractor's scoping estimate for this project is \$11,000.

We had been experiencing significant water leakage through the foundation at the base of the front stairwell. The leak appears to have been caused by the front gutter dumping water on the front walk, mulch bed, and along the foundation. This became evident when we observed a major downpour. We fixed the gutter and have repaired the masonry wall. Time will tell if this repair is permanent. We will ensure that our contractor cleans the gutter several times each year.

The main bathrooms are showing their age. Only minor repairs and upgrades have been made since reconstruction over 40 years ago. Needed renovations include new toilet stalls; new sinks & counters; new mirrors; and improved ventilation and humidity control. Some tile repairs are needed as are new doors. Because of the overall cost, we need to

prioritize these renovations.

Our 40+ year old windows are aging as well. Many leak and none are insulated

Delta Delta Loses another American Elm Tree

Doug Kosydar has previously reported that on December 20th we lost another one of the American Elm trees on our Delta



Delta property. A plant disease clinic report confirmed the presence of dutch elm disease, the disease that has resulted in the removal

> of many of the old elms we so much enjoyed when walking around campus during our days at Penn State.

> Since the tree was in dormant stage, winter was the best time to remove it. If they waited until spring, it could have spread contagion to other nearby elms. At the same time, Penn State removed one in our neighborhood in front of Dike Building. No cure for Dutch Elm Disease has been found yet and it is expected that we will

eventually lose all the elms on campus.

A month later, Penn State brought in a stump grinder and removed the most recent stump, but graciously agreed to remove the two older stumps that were on the border of our parking lot and the road running behind our fraternity. We estimate this will free up a couple more parking spaces and possibly another space on the northwest corner of the lot where the elm was removed for a smaller car. We will need to pave these stump removal areas during the summer. With the elm being on the line between University land and Penn State, there was no cost for the removal.
