Numerous Improvements Made this Year

Active Brothers Return to Dining Together at Sigma Nu and Will Welcome an In-House Cook Next Year

By now you should have received the collegiate chapter's spring newsletter so I won't repeat their significant accomplishments for this year. Rather, I congratulate them! The Property Association has completed numerous improvement projects this year and more are planned. In addition to the new stove, refrigerator, windows and basement floor, we're planning on significant upgrades to the kitchen to support an in-house cook for the next academic year. These upgrades include a new dishwasher; repairs to the dishwasher exhaust; repairs to the detergent dispensing system; and new pots, pans, utensils, dishes, flatware and glassware. In addition, we are considering the purchase of a bin-type ice maker.

We applaud the collegiate chapter for returning to dining together in the chapter house after more than a decade of eating in the dining halls. Unfortunately, our funds are running low to pay for these types of improvements. We have 61 unfulfilled pledges from our Building a New Legacy capital campaign with over \$60,000 in outstanding pledge commitments (23% of the total pledged

amount). We have many projects that are waiting on funds including, but not limited to, the House Mother's Suite, the repair of our four chimneys and renovations to the main bathrooms—all of which are 45+ years old.

We had a very successful activealumni work day on April 13, and completed numerous landscaping activities, significantly improving the condition and appearance of our lawn, shrubs and shrub beds. Our interior projects focused on a thorough cleaning of the kitchen and pantry, as well as the basement utility rooms.

Our plans for the summer are undetermined at this time but we hope to have a lunch time cookout on

Although we expect several brothers to reside in the house this summer, for security and liability reasons overnight stays by non-summer residents will not be permitted (including Arts Fest).
